TIME AND PLACE:

The Harjattula Manor / Turku (www.harjattula.fi) and Turku Christian Institute (www.tk-opisto.fi). The camp will take place from Tuesday August 2nd to Sunday August 7th 2011.

THEME:

What is it like to be a hearing impaired child or young person in Europe 2011?

PROGRAMME:

For adults: Lectures and thematic workshops based on the camp's theme. For children and young people: Plenty of different supervised activities and new experiences. Programme in the evenings for the whole family.

HOW TO GET TO TURKU?

Turku, the first capital of Finland, is located in Southwest-Finland and is easy to reach either by plane or by ferry. Turku has an international airport, but you can also choose to fly to Helsinki or Tampere and take a train or bus to Turku – the distance between Helsinki/Tampere and Turku is only two hours.
